KEVIN'S KORNER

"And now these three remain: faith, hope, and love. But the greatest of these is love" (1 Cor. 13:13). That's how Paul ends one of the most beautiful and beloved chapters in the Bible. When we think of 1 Corinthians 13, we often think of it as a rhetorically polished piece of Scripture where eloquence just seems to pour out of Paul's pen. In one respect, there is something very elevated about this passage. But in another respect, this is one of the most down-to-earth portions of Scripture you'll ever meet. Sure, it has its share of lofty language, but Paul's purpose is extremely practical, namely, to get the Christians in Corinth to act more lovingly toward one another. To do that, he offers them both his words and his walk. He wants them to see in him a model of longsuffering and kindness. He wants them to follow his own example of perseverance.

There's something about authentic Christian love that requires you to get specific. Beautiful words are good, but love resists being reduced to words, or to anything else that leaves out concrete action, like patience, kindness, humility, generosity, and forgiveness. These aren't the kinds of things you learn by separating yourself from other people and retreating within yourself. These are the kinds of things you learn by living in community with other believers – real, live human beings who will sometimes be impatient and unkind, who will get jealous, start bragging, or inflate with pride. Sometimes they will act selfishly, get provoked, or keep score. Like you, they're trusting in Jesus and striving to be more like him, but clearly none of us is completely there yet. Our love for one another is still so far from perfect.

But remember that love is a long-term project. All the Valentine's cards and gifts that get exchanged this month can certainly be generous expressions of your

love for a special person in your life. Yet at the same time, we have to be careful about trying to do in one day what we should be doing every day, namely, giving ourselves to others in the name of Christ. The kind of human love that's born out of our experience of God's love can't be concentrated into a single holiday. It can only be lived day in and day out within your network of relationships.

You can see the long-term nature of love in spouses who have been devoted to one another through thick and thin. You can see it in parents who refuse to give up on a child who has gotten into all kinds of messes and trouble. You can see it in friends who won't let time or distance sever their bond. You can see it in children who are fighting each other one minute and hugging each other the next. You can see it in deacons, teachers, and other church leaders who place service above self. You can see it in church members whose sense of common mission is bigger than their differences of opinion.

Paul says that love "always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres" (v.7). Love isn't something you master in a single day. Love is learned patterns of behavior that have to be cultivated and developed over time in the context of a community of believers who model and support loving behavior. Patience, kindness, humility, generosity, discipline, self-control, reconciliation, compassion – these are aspects of personal character that must be taught and learned through the power of the Holy Spirit at work in us. To that end, God has given us the church, the community where we learn how to love. And for that we give thanks.

GRACE'S RECIPE BOX

Pizza Snack Cup

1 can (12 oz.) refrigerated biscuits (10 biscuits)

1/4 pound ground beef
1 jar (14 oz.) RAGU Pizza Quick Sauce
1/4 cup shredded mozzarella cheese (about 2 oz.)

- 1. Preheat oven to 375°. In 12-cup muffin pan, evenly press each biscuit in bottom and up side of each cup; chill until ready to fill.
- 2. In a 10 inch skillet, brown ground beef over mediumhigh heat; drain. Stir in pizza sauce and heat through.
- 3. Evenly spoon beef mixture into prepared muffin cups. Bake 15 minutes. Sprinkle with cheese and bake an additional 5 minutes or until cheese is melted and the biscuits are golden. Let stand 5 minutes. Gently remove pizza cups from muffin pan and serve.

If you're making these to take along, try baking them in individual <u>foil</u> baking cups (not paper liners) that can stand up to travel. Just cover with additional foil for transporting.
