#### **KEVIN'S KORNER**

In his 1980s book titled *Megatrends*, futurist and social analyst John Naisbitt wrote about some of the primary patterns emerging in Western society. He highlighted the importance of a society characterized by both "high tech" and "high touch." In his words, "The more high technology around us, the more the need for human touch." During the past three and a half months, we've relied even more on high tech. We've stayed connected via our church website, email, and text messaging. Some of you may have even tried your hand at video conferencing on Zoom or another meeting app.

During the coronavirus pandemic, we've taken Grace Baptist Church online. But that's different from becoming an online church. We're still, first and foremost, a community that gathers physically. We come together as real people in a real place, to worship, work, and witness. Over the past two to three weeks, we've begun to reassemble, live and in person. The high tech is still with us. In fact, we now probably utilize it even more in our worship service. But at least the high tech is blended with the high touch, though even that is limited by masks and social distancing. We're currently in this strange zone between the way things used to be and the way we hope things will be somewhere down the road.

The church is no stranger to living in between. Our identity and mission are set between Christ's first coming and his second coming. On the one hand, we look back and remember what God has accomplished through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. On the other hand, we look forward to what God will complete when Jesus returns to reveal the fullness of

God's kingdom. Our life together in Christ is a combination of memory and hope.

The Holy Spirit is the one who sustains our hope and keeps it alive. On the Sundays before we reopened our church, I tended to focus my sermons on the gift and work of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit is Jesus' way of being with us, guiding us and empowering us as we participate in his ongoing mission in the world. That mission hasn't changed or stopped at any point during all the sickness, social unrest, and economic distress. Though separated and scattered, we've still been following Jesus, proclaiming and practicing the gospel. COVID-19 has simply been the new territory where we've been living out our calling.

Travel back in time with me to March 22. That was the first Sunday we were unable to gather, just as stay-athome orders were getting underway. In my sermon, "Where Two or Three Are Gathered," I closed with this reassurance:

In many ways, the coronavirus pandemic has isolated us from one another. But the good news is that social distancing isn't an issue for Jesus. No matter the circumstances, he draws near, comes close. Nothing keeps him from proximity to us. He enters this network of relationships called Grace Baptist Church, and occupies this communal space that we share with one another. Whether you and I are face to face or online, Jesus knows that we can't be the church without him. He has been, is now, and will be, with us. So be assured that whatever unfolds in the days ahead, he will hold our congregation together, strengthen us, and sustain us.

Days, weeks, and months have passed since then. Now it's early July. Jesus has faithfully kept his promise: "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age" (Matt. 28:20b).
